


# DCDC IS HIRING!

The Detroit Collaborative Design Center (DCDC) is a multidisciplinary, nonprofit design center based in the University of Detroit Mercy's School of Architecture and Community Development. DCDC exists to bring high-quality and community-engaged design to all neighborhoods in Detroit. We do this by engaging, educating and promoting equity in design processes and outcomes. We work with community partners citywide on a range of projects at different scales, prioritizing participation in the planning and design process with the belief that local expertise leads to the best ideas and solutions.

In the fields of design today, communities of color are poorly represented. It is essential that public interest design shift toward a profession that reflects the community it serves, particularly in Detroit. DCDC aims to contribute to that shift. We know that missing links in the path toward a career in architecture include early career opportunities that help designers gain a foothold in the profession. The Public Interest Design Fellowship will offer recent graduates an opportunity to gain their first professional experience in a PID office and start building a network in the field. Fellows will work on DCDC projects, learning and practicing community engagement, professional office systems, and architecture, landscape and urban design skills.

DCDC is seeking young designers that are eager to gain experience in public interest design. The PID Fellow will be an integral part of the DCDC team, and they will be responsible for day-to-day development of project documents and deliverables. Applicants should be interested in working collaboratively with community stakeholders and other project partners, and experience with and/or exposure to community design is a plus. Additionally, they should be highly motivated, organized and self-directed. Candidates should be recent graduates with an undergraduate or graduate degree in architecture, landscape architecture and/or urban design with 0-3 years of related work experience. Must be familiar with InDesign, Photoshop, Illustrator, AutoCAD, and SketchUp.
